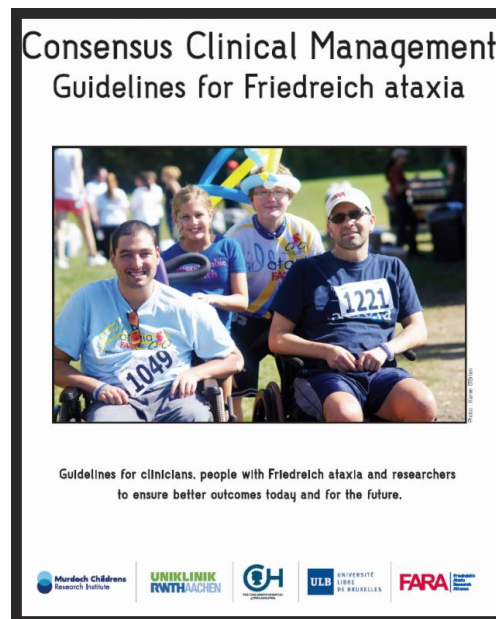


Consensus Clinical Management Guidelines for Friedreich Ataxia Now Available on the FARA Website
